

RECOMMENDATION

The City Council is requested to consider the adoption of Resolution No. 15-13, supporting SB 4 Health for All.

BACKGROUND

On March 17, 2015, the Council directed staff and the City Attorney to prepare a Resolution supporting SB 4 from Senator Ricardo Lara titled "Health for All".

ANALYSIS

The City Council expressed an interest in supporting pending state legislation SB 4, Health for All. The proposed legislation provides that all Cudahy residents should have access to affordable health care regardless of immigration status. Given that the Affordable Care Act specifically excluded undocumented immigrants from insurance coverage provided through Medi-Cal and the health care exchange, undocumented Cudahy residents cannot benefit from the Affordable Care Act. SB 4 legislation would alleviate this hardship for undocumented immigrants and benefit Cudahy residents.

CONCLUSION

After the Council adopts the Resolution No. 15-13 staff will mail a copy of the executed resolution to Senator Ricardo Lara of the California State Legislature to demonstrate the City's support of SB 4 Health for All.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Staff does not anticipate a financial impact.

RESOLUTION NO. 15-13

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY IN SUPPORT OF SB 4 (LARA) HEALTH FOR ALL

WHEREAS, the City of Cudahy (the “City”) believes that all Californians, regardless of immigration status, should have access to affordable health coverage and care; and

WHEREAS, the Affordable Care Act (ACA) specifically excluded undocumented immigrants from insurance coverage provided through Medi-Cal and the health care exchange; and

WHEREAS, People without insurance generally wait to seek care until they are seriously ill, and in many cases health problems that could have been avoided with preventive care, or treated early for little cost, become significant, and costly health issues. The impacts of this include lost productivity, increased demand on emergency services, and increased costs in our healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that the current policy of excluding undocumented immigrants from basic health care services does not reflect the City’s values, or serve the common good, to leave thousands of workers, students, and family members without treatment for preventable ailments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to affirm and declare its support for SB 4 (LARA) Health for All.

BASED UPON THE ABOVE RECITALS, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby affirms and declares that the City of Cudahy supports SB 4 (LARA) Health for All.

SECTION 2. A copy of this resolution shall be mailed by the City Clerk to Senator Ricardo Lara of the California State Legislature.



Subject: **Adoption of Resolution No. 15-11 Declaring the Results of the Consolidated General and Special Municipal Election Held on March 3, 2015**

RECOMMENDATION

The City Council is requested to adopt Resolution No. 15-11, approving the results of the Consolidated General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015.

BACKGROUND

1. On October 7, 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14-61, calling for a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, for the election of three Council Members for a full-term of four years (Attachment "A").
2. On November 4, 2014 the Council adopted Resolution No. 14-73, approving the one-time expenses in the City Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15. The approved amount for the Consolidated General and Special Municipal Election was \$105,445.
3. On November 4, 2014, pursuant to Government Code Section 36502 et seq., the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14-72, a resolution calling for a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, along with a measure to enact City Council term limits (Attachment "B").
4. On November 4, 2014, during a regular Council meeting, the Council initiated the process of adopting Ordinance 642 by proceeding with the first reading.
5. On November 10, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice of election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, to vote for three Council Members for a full-term of four years and a measure establishing term limits for Council Members commencing during the March 2017 General Municipal Elections (Attachment "C").

6. On November 11, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice of a measure to be placed on the ballot regarding an ordinance adopting term limits for Cudahy City Council Members (Attachment "D"). The notice was posted at the following locations: Lugo Park, Bedwell Hall, City Hall, Clara Street Park, Press-Telegram Newspaper, and City Website.
7. On November 26, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice to voters in regards to the deadline to submit any arguments for or against the measure to the City Clerk (Attachment "E"). The notice was posted at the following locations: Lugo Park, Bedwell Hall, City Hall, Clara Street Park, Press-Telegram Newspaper, and City Website.

9. On March 3, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office conducted the City of Cudahy's General Municipal Election and posted semi-official results on their website at www.lavote.net.
10. On March 4, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office notified the City Clerk's Office that 87 provisional ballots and 93 vote-by-mail ballots were uncouncted.
11. On March 6, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office contacted the City Clerk's Office to confirm that the remaining ballots were counted and the vote tabulations were complete.
12. On March 13, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office provided the City Clerk's Office with the Official Canvass Certificate and the Official Statement of Votes Cast for the General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015 (Attachment "F").

ANALYSIS

The City requested election services from the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office (County) due to limited staffing, transparency, and voter outreach efforts. The City has previously acquired election services from the County for the March 5, 2013 General and Special Municipal Elections. The County provided all materials, staff, and equipment to perform the elections.

After the elections were completed, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office provided the City Clerk's Office with the Official Canvass Certificate and the Official Statement of Votes Cast for the General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015 with the following results:

Baru A. Sanchez	516
Christian Hernandez	470
Cristian Markovich	445
Diane A. Oliva	348
Adam A. Ochoa	335

The election results placed candidates Baru A. Sanchez, Christian Hernandez, and Cristian Markovich as the top three candidates with the most votes. This ultimately caused turnover in one seat where newly elected Council Member Christian Hernandez will replace Council Member Diane Oliva.

Voters also approved Measure A (Ordinance No. 642), adopting Term Limits for Council Members. The Ordinance is set to take effect during the 2017 General Municipal Election and will limit Council Members to two four-year terms. The results were 672 to 133 in favor of Measure A.

CONCLUSION

After the Council approves and adopts Resolution No. 15-11, the newly elected Council Members will take an oath of office and commence their duties as Council Members. The City Clerk's Office will then declare the Mayor and Vice Mayor seats vacant. The Council will then nominate and select two members to fill the vacancies.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 36933, Ordinance No. 642 will be read and requested to be adopted during the Business Session of the April 7, 2015 City Council meeting.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The City Council and staff appropriated \$105,445 in the City Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15 for all election costs. The said amount was placed as a one-time expense and will be charged to the General Fund Reserves. The City will process the payment to the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office once the invoice(s) are received.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-61**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2015, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES**

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 1000 of the Elections Code and Section 36503 of the Government Code of the State of California, a General Municipal Election shall be held on March 3, 2015, for the election of Municipal Officers.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to General Law Cities, the City Council hereby calls and orders a General Municipal Election on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, to be held in the City of Cudahy for the purpose of electing three (3) Members of the City Council for the full term of four years.

SECTION 2. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law or as directed by the Registrar-Recorder for the County of Los Angeles to facilitate the consolidation of the 2015 City Election with the County-administered election of the same date.

SECTION 3. That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

SECTION 4. That the polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in § 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 5. That any compensation afforded to precinct board members and other poll workers pursuant to Elections Code § 12310 shall be in keeping with the rates set forth by the Registrar of Voters for the County of Los Angeles.


SECTION 6. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

SECTION 7. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION 8. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.





RESOLUTION NO. 14-72

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2015, FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS A MEASURE TO ENACT CITY COUNCIL TERM LIMITS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 36502(b), any proposal to limit the number of terms a member of the City Council may serve on the City Council shall apply prospectively only and shall not become operative unless it is submitted to the electors of the City at a regularly scheduled election and a majority of the votes cast on the proposed term limits favor the adoption of the term limits; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cudahy, California, desires to enact term limits for members of the Cudahy City Council ("City Council"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Cudahy ("City") has called for a General Municipal Election on March 3, 2015, and the City Council desires to submit to the voters at the March 3rd General Municipal Election a measure relating to the enactment of City Council term limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Cudahy, California, on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, a General Municipal Election.

SECTION 2. The City Council does hereby order submitted to the voters at the March 3, 2015 General Municipal Election the following ballot measure:

Measure : Shall the ordinance adopting term limits for Cudahy City Council Members be adopted?	YES
These term limits provide that no person shall serve more than eight years, or two four-year terms as a member of the Cudahy City Council, with any portion of a term, whether by election or appointment, counting as a full term.	NO

SECTION 3. The ordinance adopting term limits shall not be operative unless Measure is approved by a majority of the votes cast at the March 3rd General Municipal Election. The text of the ordinance shall be submitted to the voters (attached as Exhibit A).

SECTION 4. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

SECTION 6. That the polls shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in § 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.



SECTION 9. That the City shall reimburse the County of Los Angeles for costs incurred on behalf of the City.



ORDINANCE NO. 642

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY ADOPTING TERM LIMITS FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 36502, SUBJECT TO VOTER APPROVAL

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cudahy ("City Council") approved Resolution No.14-61, which called a General Municipal Election to be held on March 3, 2015 (the "2015 City Election") for the City of Cudahy ("City") voters to elect candidates to the offices of City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved Resolution No. 14-72, which ordered the submission of a ballot measure to the City voters at the 2015 City Election relating to the adoption of term limits for City Council Members, as provided by *Government Code* section 36502; and

WHEREAS, no such term limits shall apply to City Council Members unless and until such term limits are approved by a majority of votes cast on the ballot measure at the 2015 City Election, and, pursuant to the Government Code, such term limits shall apply prospectively to all City Council Members in office beginning with the 2017 General Municipal Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The facts set forth in the recitals above are true and correct.

SECTION 2. Section 2.04.100 (Term Limits) is hereby added to Chapter 2.04 (City Council) of the Cudahy Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 2.04.100 TERM LIMITS

Pursuant to the authority granted to the city under *Government Code* section 36502, no person shall serve more than eight (8) years, or two (2) four-year terms as a member of the Cudahy City Council, with any portion of a term, whether by election or appointment, counting as a full term.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 4. This ordinance is not a "project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Action codified as section 21000 et seq. of the *Public Resources Code* ("CEQA") because it will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect

physical change in the environment nor does it involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

SECTION 5. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall timely cause the same to be published once in the official newspaper. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the certification of an affirmative majority vote of the City voters in favor of term limits at the March 3, 2015 General Municipal Election.





IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE ____:

This Measure was placed on the ballot by the City Council for the City of Cudahy. The City Council for the City of Cudahy is comprised of five elected City Council members. California state law authorizes cities to establish limits on the number of terms a Council member may serve in office. Term limits must be approved by the voters of the City of Cudahy.

Currently, City of Cudahy Council members may serve an unlimited number of City Council terms. If a majority of voters vote "yes" to approve this Measure, the City of Cudahy Municipal Code will be amended to create lifetime term limits for Cudahy City Council members. If approved, the Measure will prohibit a person from serving as a member of the City Council for more than two four-year terms. A partial term served in office would count as a full four-year term for purposes of computing the term limitation. If approved, the proposed Measure will effectively create a lifetime term limit for Council members of eight years.

If approved, the Measure would apply prospectively only, meaning the terms a Council member served that commenced prior to the adoption of this Measure would not count toward the newly adopted lifetime term limit. Instead, only terms that began on or after the March 2017 election, would count toward the lifetime term limits. Therefore, if the Measure is approved, terms for Council members that are being voted on at the same election as this Measure will not be included as a term counting toward the lifetime term limits ban.



RECOMMENDATION

The City Council is requested to adopt Ordinance No. 642, an ordinance to establish term limits for Council Members, approved by the voters during the Consolidated General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015.

BACKGROUND

1. On October 7, 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14-61, calling for a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, for the election of three Council Members for a full-term of four years (Attachment "A").
2. On November 4, 2014 the Council adopted Resolution No. 14-73, approving the one-time expenses in the City Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15. The approved amount for the Consolidated General and Special Municipal Election was \$105,445.
3. On November 4, 2014, pursuant to Government Code Section 36502 et seq., the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14-72, a resolution calling for a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, along with a measure to enact City Council term limits (Attachment "B").
4. On November 4, 2014, during a regular Council meeting, the Council initiated the process of adopting Ordinance 642 by proceeding with the first reading.
5. On November 10, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice of election to be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, to vote for three Council Members for a full-term of four years and a measure establishing term limits for Council Members commencing during

the March 2017 General Municipal Elections (Attachment "C").

6. On November 11, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice of a measure to be placed on the ballot regarding an ordinance adopting term limits for Cudahy City Council Members (Attachment "D"). The notice was posted at the following locations: Lugo Park, Bedwell Hall, City Hall, Clara Street Park, Press-Telegram Newspaper, and City Website.
7. On November 26, 2014, the City Clerk's Office posted a notice to voters in regards to the deadline to submit any arguments for or against the measure to the City Clerk (Attachment "E"). The notice was posted at the following locations: Lugo Park, Bedwell Hall, City Hall, Clara Street Park, Press-Telegram Newspaper, and City Website.
8. On March 3, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office conducted the City of Cudahy's General Municipal Election and posted semi-official results on their website at www.lavote.net.
9. On March 4, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office notified the City Clerk's Office that 87 provisional ballots and 93 vote-by-mail ballots were uncouncted.
10. On March 6, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office contacted the City Clerk's Office to confirm that the remaining ballots were counted and the vote tabulations were complete.
11. On March 13, 2015, the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office provided the City Clerk's Office with the Official Canvass Certificate and the Official Statement of Votes Cast for the General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015 (Attachment "F").
12. On April 2, 2015, pursuant to Government Code Section 36933 the City Clerk's Office published a summary of Ordinance 642 in the Press-Telegram Newspaper.

ANALYSIS

The City requested election services from the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office (County) due to limited staffing, transparency, and voter outreach efforts. The City has previously acquired election services from the County for the March 5, 2013 General and Special Municipal Elections. The County provided all materials, staff, and equipment to perform the elections.

The County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office provided the City Clerk's Office with the Official Canvass Certificate and the Official Statement of Votes Cast for the General and Special Municipal Election held on March 3, 2015 with the following results

regarding Ordinance No. 642, titled on the ballot as Measure A:

Yes 672

No 133

The Ordinance becomes effective during the 2017 General Municipal Election and will limit a Council Members to two four-year terms.

CONCLUSION

If the Council adopts Ordinance No. 642, the ordinance will go into effect during the March 2017 General Municipal Election and will be codified as Section 2.04.100 in the Cudahy Municipal Code under Chapter 2.04.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The City Council and staff appropriated \$105,445 in the City Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15 for all of the election costs. The said amount was placed as a one-time expense and will be charged to the General Fund Reserves. The City will process the payment to the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office once the invoice(s) are received.

SECTION 2. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law or as directed by the Registrar-Recorder for the County of Los Angeles to facilitate the consolidation of the 2015 City Election with the County-administered election of the same date.

SECTION 3. That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

SECTION 4. That the polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in § 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 5. That any compensation afforded to precinct board members and other poll workers pursuant to Elections Code § 12310 shall be in keeping with the rates set forth by the Registrar of Voters for the County of Los Angeles.

SECTION 6. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

SECTION 7. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION 8. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.





NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Cudahy, California, on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, a General Municipal Election.

SECTION 2. The City Council does hereby order submitted to the voters at the March 3, 2015 General Municipal Election the following ballot measure:

Measure : Shall the ordinance adopting term limits for Cudahy City Council Members be adopted?	YES
These term limits provide that no person shall serve more than eight years, or two four-year terms as a member of the Cudahy City Council, with any portion of a term, whether by election or appointment, counting as a full term.	NO

SECTION 3. The ordinance adopting term limits shall not be operative unless Measure is approved by a majority of the votes cast at the March 3rd General Municipal Election. The text of the ordinance shall be submitted to the voters (attached as Exhibit A).

SECTION 4. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.





ORDINANCE NO. 642

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY ADOPTING TERM LIMITS FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 36502, SUBJECT TO VOTER APPROVAL

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cudahy ("City Council") approved Resolution No.14-61, which called a General Municipal Election to be held on March 3, 2015 (the "2015 City Election") for the City of Cudahy ("City") voters to elect candidates to the offices of City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved Resolution No. 14-72, which ordered the submission of a ballot measure to the City voters at the 2015 City Election relating to the adoption of term limits for City Council Members, as provided by *Government Code* section 36502; and

WHEREAS, no such term limits shall apply to City Council Members unless and until such term limits are approved by a majority of votes cast on the ballot measure at the 2015 City Election, and, pursuant to the Government Code, such term limits shall apply prospectively to all City Council Members in office beginning with the 2017 General Municipal Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The facts set forth in the recitals above are true and correct.

SECTION 2. Section 2.04.100 (Term Limits) is hereby added to Chapter 2.04 (City Council) of the Cudahy Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 2.04.100 TERM LIMITS

Pursuant to the authority granted to the city under *Government Code* section 36502, no person shall serve more than eight (8) years, or two (2) four-year terms as a member of the Cudahy City Council, with any portion of a term, whether by election or appointment, counting as a full term.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 4. This ordinance is not a "project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Action codified as section 21000 et seq. of the *Public Resources Code* ("CEQA") because it will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect

physical change in the environment nor does it involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

SECTION 5. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall timely cause the same to be published once in the official newspaper. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the certification of an affirmative majority vote of the City voters in favor of term limits at the March 3, 2015 General Municipal Election.







ORDINANCE NO. 642

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY ADOPTING TERM LIMITS FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 36502, SUBJECT TO VOTER APPROVAL

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cudahy (“City Council”) approved Resolution No.14-61, which called a General Municipal Election to be held on March 3, 2015 (the “2015 City Election”) for the City of Cudahy (“City”) voters to elect candidates to the offices of City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved Resolution No. 14-72, which ordered the submission of a ballot measure to the City voters at the 2015 City Election relating to the adoption of term limits for City Council Members, as provided by *Government Code* section 36502; and

WHEREAS, no such term limits shall apply to City Council Members unless and until such term limits are approved by a majority of votes cast on the ballot measure at the 2015 City Election, and, pursuant to the Government Code, such term limits shall apply prospectively to all City Council Members in office beginning with the 2017 General Municipal Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The facts set forth in the recitals above are true and correct.

SECTION 2. Section 2.04.100 (Term Limits) is hereby added to Chapter 2.04 (City Council) of the Cudahy Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 2.04.100 TERM LIMITS

Pursuant to the authority granted to the city under *Government Code* section 36502, no person shall serve more than eight (8) years, or two (2) four-year terms as a member of the Cudahy City Council, with any portion of a term, whether by election or appointment, counting as a full term.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 4. This ordinance is not a “project” within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Action codified as section 21000 et seq. of the *Public Resources Code* (“CEQA”) because it will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect

physical change in the environment nor does it involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

SECTION 5. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall timely cause the same to be published once in the official newspaper. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the certification of an affirmative majority vote of the City voters in favor of term limits at the March 3, 2015 General Municipal Election.
