City Manager's Office

Animal Control

Officers from the Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) will be conducting field licensing enforcement in the City of Cudahy beginning on Wednesday, April 29, 2015. Field enforcement efforts are designed to ensure that residents' dogs and cats are in compliance with licensing requirements. California State law requires that all dogs over the age of four months be vaccinated against rabies and be licensed. Beginning January 1, 2014, puppies may be vaccinated at three months old, but still are not required to be vaccinated until four months of age. Securing a dog or cat license is essential to assisting animal control agencies if a pet becomes lost.

The licensing fees for City residents are as follows:

- Unaltered dog: \$60
- Altered dog: \$20
- Altered dog belonging to a senior citizen (60 years of age or older): \$7.50
- Unaltered cat: \$10
- Altered cat: \$5
- Penalty fee: Equal to the license fee

Pet owners are advised to be in compliance with the licensing ordinance. Residents not in compliance will be subject to license fees and delinquency charges, including a \$40 field enforcement fee, to offset the cost of the Department's field services. In order to avoid penalties, be sure to license your dog. You can secure a new dog license by printing the application online at <http://animalcare.lacounty.gov>, or visiting your local County animal care center. If your license is not delinquent, you can also renew it through the internet.

Students Recognized

The City recognized over 60 students from Ellen Ochoa Learning Center who helped with the January Clean-Up Day on April 7, 2015 at 4:30 p.m. LAUSD Board Member Bennett Kayser, Jesus Dias representing Senator Ricardo Lara and the then Cudahy Mayor Chris Garcia presented certificates of recognition to the students. The City hopes to continue a positive relationship with City students.

Insurance Training Update

The City will host two training sessions, "Team Building and Communication" and "Writing for Success", that will be provided by the City's insurance company, California Joint Powers Insurance Authority (CJPIA). These two training sessions are available to all cities and agencies in our insurance pool.

The Team Building and Communication will take place on April 9, 2015 at Clara Street Park. This training teaches tools for employees, supervisors, departments and work teams to cooperate, communicate, and know when and how to give each other feedback, support and praise. This session offers employees and supervisors motivation, new ideas and tools for working more effectively in our current environment.

Writing for Success will take place on April 14, 2015 at Clara Street Park. This course will help supervisors, technically-based employees, and those who struggle with the communication facets of their work projects, to become better writers. This half-day program was designed for busy people who don't want or need to go through Grammar and English Composition 101 to improve their writing.

Cudahy Clean-Up Day - April 25, 2015

The City has partnered with Republic Services, LAUSD Board Member Kayser's Office and Ellen Ochoa Learning Center to put together our upcoming Clean-Up Day event. See attached flyer. The City Council nominated and selected Cristian Markovich to serve as Mayor for a term of one year ending in April 2016. The Council then selected newly elected Councilman Christian Hernandez to serve as Mayor Pro

Tempore (Vice Mayor). The results of the nominations/selections were posted within 24-hours on the City's Website, Lugo Park, Clara Street Park, and Bedwell Hall.

Finance Department

Mid-Year Budget Review

At the Tuesday, April 21, 2015 Regular City Council Meeting there will be a first ever mid-year budget review presented to the City Council. This presentation will review the City's revenues and expenditures through December 31, 2014, as well as, a proposed resolution for additional projects that the City Council has approved at recent City Council meetings.

Quarterly Tax Report Filings

The City is preparing to submit the 941-Internal Revenue Services (IRS) form for federal & medicare taxes, and DE9 & DE9c forms for the California state taxes which are due by April 30, 2015. At the end of each quarter the City files a 941 form to the IRS; reporting wages earned by employees, the withholding amounts for federal income tax, and the withholding amounts for Medicare taxes. The City is also preparing to submit forms DE9 and DE9c to the California Employment Development Department (EDD) due the same date, April 30, 2015. The purpose for these reports is to report the withholding amounts for California state taxes and earned wages for employees.

Community Development and Services Department

Clara Park Expansion Project Grand Opening and Dedication

Staff is excited to announce the fast approaching completion of the Clara Park Expansion Project. At the close of the week of April 13-17, only minor landscaping is left to done. The project is scheduled for completion by April 20, which will include include a walking path, landscaping, picnic areas, and outdoor exercise equipment. A final walk through is scheduled with the California State Parks Project Manager on April 23, 2015 which will close the project out. Although the grand opening date was previously set at May 1, 2015, due to scheduling conflicts the ceremony has been

postponed. Please keep a lookout in future City Manager Reports for the announcement of the date for the grand opening ceremony.

Lugo Park Soccer Field and Restroom Rehabilitation Project

As discussed in the March 6, 2015 City Manager's Report, City staff has been meeting with the design team for the rehabilitation project. At the March 17, 2015 City Council meeting a professional services agreement was awarded to Transtech who will see this project through. Transtech is currently preparing a presentation and recommendation for City Council consideration at the May 5, 2015 City Council meeting. Transtech will propose a final design and cost estimate to include a regulation size soccer field, restroom and concession facility, all weather walking path, and protective netting along the north side of the park.

Bedwell Hall Roof Replacement Project (CDBG)

The Bedwell Hall Roof Replacement Project is currently ongoing. This project consists of providing all labor, equipment, and materials to replace the existing modified bitumen roof system over the Bedwell Hall building. After two weeks of hard work, the project is approximately 85% complete and it is expected to be completed by April 2015.

Food Distribution

The upcoming Food Distribution Program is scheduled to take place on Thursday, April 23, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Please be sure to have valid proof of residency on hand to avoid being turned away at the door. First-time participants are encouraged to make note of the information provided below.

Frequently asked questions:

Q. When will the Food Distribution Program take place? A. Typically our FoodDistribution Program takes place the 4th Thursday of every month. However, during the months of November and December, the program will take place the 3rd Thursday of the month.

Q. What time does the program begin? A. The program begins promptly at 8:30 a.m. **Q. What time does the program end?** A. Doors close when all goods have been distributed or 10:00AM, whichever comes first.

Q. Who is eligible to participate in the program? A. This program is open to Cudahy Residents only.

Q. What do I need to provide as proof of Cudahy residency? A. Valid State of California Identification/Driver's License with a Cudahy address or photo identification along with a current bill/formal correspondence, which contains your name and Cudahy address.

Q. What can I do to ensure the receipt of goods? A. Service will be provided on a first come, first serve basis. Early arrival is recommended due to limited quantities.

Q. How early can I arrive? A. Site access will be allowed no earlier than 5:30 a.m.

Q. Do I need to bring a reusable bag or cart to carry my goods? A. We strongly recommend that you bring your reusable bags or carts; particularly if you are traveling on foot. The bags provided are plastic and may tear due to the weight of the items provided.

Q. Will I be allowed to collect goods for my family member/friend/neighbor? A. No. They must present themselves the day of the event in order to receive services.

Q. What if I am the care-taker of a resident and they are not able to be present themselves the day of the program due to illness? A. Arrangements for a home delivery must be made prior to the program date. Medical documentation proving disability/illness must be provided. For more information on home delivery services, please contact Mr. Ruben Vasquez at (323) 773-5143, ext. 245.

Q. What if there are multiple families living in my household? Are we allowed to collect additional goods? A. No. Unfortunately, we are only able provide one unit of goods per household. Q. If I do not arrive on time to receive services, will I still be able to receive goods at a later time? A. No. Unfortunately, once all the items have been distributed, we will no longer be providing goods until the subsequent program date.

Q. If I do not possess my proof of residency the morning of the event, will I still be able to participate in the program? A. No, we will not provide service to those who do not possess valid proof of residency. No exceptions.

Q. If I've already been registered for the program during the program year, do I still need to provide valid proof of residency? A. Yes. Valid proof of residence must be provided every time you present yourself to participate in the program.


City Facility Reservations
