RECOMMENDATION

The Public Safety Commission is requested to receive and file the Code Enforcement monthly Report.

BACKGROUND

The Code Enforcement Department is funded through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and City General Funds. The project enforces the City of Cudahy's zoning, building and property maintenance ordinances to reduce conditions that are injurious and inimical to the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City, additionally the Dept. contributes substantially and increasingly to the protection against hazards and diminution of property values, the prevention of crime, the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare, and the maintenance of police, fire, and accident protection. This project attempts to improve the condition of housing stock in coordination with the Housing Rehabilitation Program, which undertakes the actual rehabilitation of houses with referrals, and property in the City of Cudahy where it is most needed, and strives to maintain those improvements.

ANALYSIS

The Code Enforcement Department report for the month of April identifies the common property maintenance violations (PMV). The most common violation citation codes are:

- a. CMC 15.20.020 – Prohibited Conditions
- b. CMC 15.01.060 – Violation of Building Code

This analysis is for the month of April that shows the number of open and closed cases, and the type of violations.

CONCLUSION
