Engineering

- ✦ Santa Ana St (Site 2) and Clara St (Site 6) Demolition Project – Project was completed on 10/29/21. Acceptance of the Project Notice of Completion by Cudahy City Council is scheduled for Tuesday November 16, 2021 at its Regular Council Meeting.
- ✦ City Facilities Condition Assessment, Maintenance Plan, and Space Utilization Study RFP - Request for Proposals (RFP) to solicit the above services was issued and posted on City's website on Monday 11/01/2021. Deadline to submit proposals is 12/15/2021.
- ✦ Pedestrian Crosswalk at Clara Park and Clara Park Expansion – Work order to repair, furnish, and reinstall the pedestrian crosswalk located at Clara Park and Clara Park Expansion was issued on 11/09/2021 to Siemens, Inc., the City's Traffic Signal Maintenance Contractor. The scope of work includes the installation of a 12' pole on the existing foundation and complete with the Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) system in the center median. The City will keep you posted on the progress of the project.
- ✦ City of Cudahy - Efficiency | Renewable Energy Project – A public hearing and approval of a letter of intent for this purpose was approved by Cudahy City Council at its regular meeting held on 11/02/21. City Staff and Siemens personnel will continue working on the next phase of the project (Detailed Study). The City will keep you posted on the progress of the project.

Methodology:
Monthly city labor force data are derived by multiplying current estimates of county employment and unemployment by the relative employment and unemployment shares (ratios) of each city at the time of the 2015-2019 American Community Survey. Ratios for cities were developed from special tabulations based on ACS employment, unemployment, and population and Census population from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. For smaller cities and CDPs, ratios were calculated from published census data.
Monthly CDP's labor force data are derived by multiplying current estimates of county employment and unemployment by the relative employment and unemployment shares (ratios) of each CDP at the time of the 2015-2019 ACS survey. Ratios for CDPs' were developed from special tabulations based on ACS employment and unemployment from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
This method assumes that the rates of change in employment and unemployment since the 2015-2019 American Community Survey are exactly the same in each city and CDP as at the county level (i.e., that the shares are still accurate). If this assumption is not true for a specific city or CDP, then the estimates for that area may not represent the current economic conditions. Since this assumption is untested, caution should be employed when using these data.
