### Community Preservation

- ❖ Staff has coordinated with Republic Services and created a 2022 Bulky Item Schedule (Attachment 2). The schedule was created to inform residents of the hours the bulky truck will pass in their area and to avoid any prolonged and premature bulky take out.
- ❖ **2** Violation Notices were issued. 1 for no business license (food vendor) 1 for keeping of animals (roosters).
- ❖ **3** Friendly Reminders were issued regarding trash cans out before the allowed day and time.
- ❖ Public Safety stats from the Sheriff's Department (Attachment 3).
- ❖ A Public Safety meeting took place on March 8, 2022.

### Parking Enforcement

- ❖ **2** vehicles were red tagged in violation of 72 hrs.
- ❖ **2** vehicles were towed, 1 for 72hrs and 1 for expired registration.
- ❖ **485** parking citations were issued (see attachment 4).
- ❖ Parking Enforcement Officer interviews are ongoing.

### Building & Safety

- ❖ Business at 4915 Cecelia was given a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy
- ❖ Finalizing county and state surveys
- ❖ Project at 4302-12 Elizabeth was given a Certificate of Occupancy

### Public Works/ Engineering

- ❖ **Active Transportation Project Cycle 2 (ATP-2) Project** – Project is currently under construction. ADA ramps and sidewalk curb extensions have been completed this week. Contractor continues working on installation of pedestrian lighting poles.
- ❖ **Local Roadway Safety Plan (LRSP)** – City's Consultant, Kimley-Horn & Associates, Inc., is working on the City's LRSP Plan. City staff and consultant meets bi-weekly for project coordination.

- ❖ **Clean California Local Grant (CCLG)** – The City of Cudahy is pleased to announce that it was awarded nearly \$5 Million for its “Cudahy Los Angeles River Area Improvement Project” without requiring a local match. The project grant application was prepared in-house by City Staff and includes citywide beautification improvements at LA River Bike Path, Cudahy River Park, Clara Bridge Slopes and Otis Avenue Pocket Park. A total of 329 applications were received statewide and only 105 projects were selected for funding.
- ❖ **Equitable Communities Revitalization Grant (ECGR)** – City Staff is working on final scope of work to apply under this grant opportunity. The ECGR Grant or “Brownfields” Grant provides funding for environmental studies and remediation plans for contaminated sites.
- ❖ **City of Cudahy - Efficiency | Renewable Energy Project** – City Staff and Siemens Personnel continue working on developing the project scope of work. City Staff attended this week the Empower Grant Presentation by Siemens (a community-based type program/grant). City will apply for this grant opportunity within the following weeks.
- ❖ **Public Works Activities**
  - **Street and City Facilities Maintenance** – Public Works Department continues working on maintenance routine activities such as graffiti removal, bulky items pick-up on non-designated days, traffic signs replacement, pothole repairs and vegetation control. During the last week city forces have been also working on red curb painting and maintenance of the LA River Trail.
  - **Traffic Signal and Street Lighting Maintenance** – Public Works staff continues working diligently on traffic signal and street lighting maintenance activities with our city’s traffic signal and streetlight maintenance contractor, including coordination with SCE. Due to a long delay in materials supply few locations have not been served per schedule.

## Parks & Recreation

- ❖ **VITA Program**  
In partnership with the Mexican American Opportunity Foundation (MAOF), the City is pleased to announce the return of the IRS’s Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program (VITA) event. The VITA event offers free tax help to people who need assistance preparing their tax returns. The event is scheduled to occur at Clara Street Park (Turner Hall) on Tuesday, March 22, 2022, from 11 am to 7 pm. The program is for anybody living in the Southeast area and will be available on a first-come-first-served basis.
- ❖ **Food Distribution**  
The monthly Food Distribution Program is scheduled to take place on Thursday, March 24, 2022, from 9 am to 12 noon at Clara Street Park

❖ **Take-Home Easter Kits sign-ups**

Bring an Easter Kit home. The City will be distributing 400 Easter kits next month. The kit will include candy, easter eggs, bunny ears, and a kraft activity to host your egg hunt safely at home. Registration begins Tuesday, March 29. Visit the City's website or social media pages for the link. Kits will be handed out Thursday, April 14, at Clara Street Park. The event is only for Cudahy residents.
