### Public Works/ Engineering

- ❖ **Active Transportation Project Cycle 2 (ATP-2) Project** – Project currently under construction. Contractor has completed pothole investigation and utilities coordination work.
- ❖ **Local Roadway Safety Plan (LRSP)** – Kick-off meeting between City Staff and Consultant took place on 02-22-2022. The consultant, Kimley-Horn & Associates, Inc., has initiated the City's LRSP Plan.
- ❖ **Equitable Communities Revitalization Grant (ECGR)** – City Staff is exploring potential sites and scope of work to apply under this grant opportunity. The ECGR Grant or "Brownfields" Grant includes environmental studies and remediation plans for contaminated sites.
- ❖ **City of Cudahy - Efficiency | Renewable Energy Project** – City Staff and Siemens Personnel continue working on developing the project scope of work.
- ❖ **Public Works Activities**
  - **Street and City Facilities Maintenance** – Public Works Department continues working on maintenance routine activities such as graffiti removal, bulky items pick-up on non-designated days, traffic signs replacement, pothole repairs and vegetation control. During the last week city forces have been also working on red curb painting throughout the city.

- **Traffic Signal and Street Lighting Maintenance** – Public Works staff continues working and coordinating traffic signal and street lighting maintenance activities with our city’s traffic signal and streetlight maintenance contractor (This includes coordination with SCE).
