### Public Works/ Engineering

- ❖ **Active Transportation Project Cycle 2 (ATP-2) Project** – Project is currently under construction. Foundation work for street light poles has been completed this week. Contractor will continue working on electrical installations.
- ❖ **Local Roadway Safety Plan (LRSP)** – City’s Consultant, Kimley-Horn & Associates, Inc., has completed preliminary traffic data collection for the city.
- ❖ **Equitable Communities Revitalization Grant (ECGR)** – City Staff is currently working on the ECGR Grant (“Brownfields” Grant), which provides funding for environmental studies and remediation plans for contaminated sites (City plans to include City of Cudahy and Successor Agency eligible properties located in the City).
- ❖ **City of Cudahy - Efficiency | Renewable Energy Project** – City Staff in coordination with Siemens’s personnel is working on putting together the final scope of work.
- ❖ **Public Works Activities**
  - **Street, Parks, and City Facilities Maintenance** – Public Works Department continues working on maintenance routine activities such as graffiti removal, bulky items pick-up on non-designated days, vegetation control and red curb painting within the last week. Public Works crew will be assisting in the City’s upcoming Clean-Up Day to take place on Saturday March 26 from 8 am to 1 pm (several locations citywide).
  - **Traffic Signal and Street Lighting Maintenance** – City’s Street lighting contractor, Siemens, has completed street light repairs on River Road. Traffic signal

maintenance activities continue routinely and as needed to keep traffic signals in proper working conditions.

### **Parks & Recreation**

- ❖ Basketball Gym Special Hours
  - The Clara Street basketball gym will open early during the Los Angeles Unified School District Spring break from Monday, April 11 through Friday, April 15. Hours of operation will be from 10 am to 8 pm.
- ❖ Easter Kit Giveaway
  - Easter kits giveaway will take place Thursday, April 14, from noon to 7 pm at Clara Street Park (4835 Clara Street). Pre-registration is required. The event is only for Cudahy residents.
- ❖ LA Food Bank Food Distribution
  - The next LA Food Bank will take place Thursday, April 14 from 9 am to noon or until quantities are depleted. The event will occur at Clara Street Park (4835 Clara Street). The Food Distribution is open to all Southeast residents.
- ❖ Breathe LA County's Enrollment Center
  - Los Angeles County is launching a program (Breathe) that will provide 1,00 eligible residents with a monthly income of \$1,000 per month for three years. The city partnered with South Bay Community Change (SBCC) to host an enrollment center at Clara Street Park to assist community members in applying for the program. **Methodology:**

Monthly city labor force data are derived by multiplying current estimates of county employment and unemployment by the relative employment and unemployment shares (ratios) of each city at the time of the 2015-2019 American Community Survey. Ratios for cities were developed from special tabulations based on ACS employment, unemployment, and population and Census population from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. For smaller cities and CDPs, ratios were calculated from published census data.

Monthly CDP's labor force data are derived by multiplying current estimates of county employment and unemployment by the relative employment and unemployment shares (ratios) of each CDP at the time of the 2015-2019 ACS survey. Ratios for CDPs' were developed from special tabulations based on ACS employment and unemployment from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

This method assumes that the rates of change in employment and unemployment since the 2015-2019 American Community Survey are exactly the same in each city and CDP as at the county level (i.e., that the shares are still accurate). If this assumption is not true for a specific city or CDP, then the estimates for that area may not represent the current economic conditions. Since this assumption is untested, caution should be employed when using these data.
