**NOTICE OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION  
 ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022**

**AND**

**SYNOPSIS OF BALLOT MEASURE TO BE VOTED ON**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Cudahy on Tuesday, November 8, 2022. This election will be administered by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk for the County of Los Angeles.

City of Cudahy voters will be presented with one (1) ballot measure entitled **Measure BA - Cannabis Business Accountability Measure** which poses the following question:

<p><b>Cannabis Business Accountability Measure</b></p> <p>To increase funding for parks, recreational programs, roads and sidewalks and other general governmental purposes, shall an ordinance authorizing and regulating storefront retail cannabis sales and other commercial cannabis activities be approved with prohibitions on retail operations within 600 feet of schools, churches, childcare facilities and other sensitive uses and with retailers required to pay a 15% gross receipts tax to raise approximately \$3,581,952.75 annually until ended by Cudahy voters?</p>	<input type="checkbox"/> YES

**SYNOPSIS OF MEASURE TO BE VOTED ON:**

The Cannabis Business Accountability Measure (“Measure”) amends the Cudahy Municipal Code by establishing provisions that authorize and regulate the retail (storefront) sale of medicinal and adult-use (recreational) cannabis and cannabis products in the City. Under the Measure, the total number of retail cannabis business permits for retailers based within the City will be limited to two (2), with one (1) retail cannabis business permit to be issued to a retailer located in the Civic Mixed-Use Zone, and one (1) retail cannabis business permit to be issued to a retailer located in the Urban Agriculture Overlay Zone. Permitted cannabis retailers


would not be allowed to operate within six hundred (600) feet from any school, day care center, youth center, or place of religious assembly. Such business would not be allowed to operate outside of the Cudahy's Civic Mixed-Use or Urban Agriculture Overlay Zone.

The Measure also establishes a fifteen percent (15%) tax on the gross receipts on retail sales of medicinal and adult-use cannabis and cannabis products sold by those retail cannabis businesses regulated under the Measure. The tax is established as "general tax" within the meaning of the California Constitution which means its proceeds may be used for any general governmental purpose. Pursuant to Section 2(b) of Article XIII C of the California Constitution and Government Code Section 53723, general tax measures must be approved by simple majority (at least 50% plus 1) of votes cast at the City's upcoming November 8, 2022 General Municipal Election.

A "yes" vote for the Measure means a voter approves of its enactment.

A "no" vote means a voter does not approve of the Measure's enactment.
